- Summary of key findings:
 - Most (16/22) institutions have explicit funding sources available for inquiry projects into teaching
 - o 6 additionally have funding sources available for SoTL dissemination
 - 12 institutions have staff described as supporting SoTL/teaching research
 - The most common forms of SoTL programming are communities of practice and multisession programs
 - The scan provided inspiration for other possible initiatives (institutional SoTL publication list, 'SoTL Snapshots' research updates, SoTL writing retreats, etc.)
